





Back-to-back storms bring high winds, driving rain

Much of Southcentral Alaska was hit twice in the past several weeks with storms bringing high winds and severe rain. Over the long Thanksgiving holiday, there were multiple outages in the Chugach service territory as heavy rain poured down in Anchorage, along with high winds gusting up to 100 miles per hour. Linemen from Chugach and our contractors were out in the storm, working round-the-clock to restore power.

Just over a week later, another storm hit on Monday, Dec. 9, once again with heavy rain and severe wind. Outages from the second storm hit several communities south of Anchorage, including Indian, Girdwood, Whittier, Hope, and Cooper Landing. In that type of weather, the major cause of outages is downed trees, downed power lines and broken poles.

Chugach thanks our members for your patience during these storms and outages. Our crews always work to restore power as safely and quickly as possible. The storms are also good reminders to have disaster supplies on hand in case of major events. It's recommended to have a sevenday supply of food, water, medicine, and other essentials in case of an emergency.





Helpful outage tools for members

During a storm or other major event that triggers power outages, members have tools to use to keep them in touch with the cooperative.

Report an outage

Although Chugach's meters report directly to the utility when power is out, members can also report their outage. You can call the outage hotline at 762-7888, or report the outage on our website. The website provides a form asking for your street number and street name. It's easy to fill out and submit.

Chugach provides outage updates through our

Member Services department and via social media. Members can also track outages using our automated online map that shows the general area of the outage and the number of members impacted.
